Description	This course provides an introduction to the institutional environment shaping the economics of business and entrepreneurship in emerging economies. The role of the state and formal political institutions, as well as civi society and informal institutions, are analysed. Particular emphasis is placed on the allocation of entrepreneurial talent and its impact on business and economic development. The institutional framework ('rules of the game' or 'reward structure of society') is taken as a point of departure to explain how the allocation of entrepreneurial talent can give rise to either productive or non-productive forms of entrepreneurship, the latter including topics such as bureaucratic corruption and regulatory capture by interes groups. The course will also cover destructive forms of entrepreneurship, including violent conflicts and human rights abuses by corporations in emerging economies.
