Goals	<p>Solid understanding of the audit process; Basic knowledge of the academic literature on auditing; Obtain problem solving skills in auditing settings and develop experience in using and interpreting data in common decision contexts.</p> <p>Graduates have academic, evidence-based knowledge and understanding of theories, methods and tools in business/economics. Graduates can apply their knowledge and understanding to identify and solve real life business/economic problems. This includes demonstrating analytical skills and a problem-solving attitude. Graduates can inform Judgments on theoretical and practical business/economic issues. Graduates can find, read and understand relevant research. Graduates have largely self-directed learning skills and the ability to regulate their own learning process.</p>																		
Description	<p>The course is aimed at giving students a solid introduction to auditing. The evolution of the auditing function, the role of auditing in a modern economy, the different manifestations of auditing, as well as the most elementary auditing techniques are discussed. The course is linked to audit practice by means of case-studies, a workshop in collaboration with a large audit firm and a guest lecture.</p>
