How are wealth and poverty related to changes in health, life expectancy, education, population growth and politics? Emphasis is placed on periods of economic transition (emergence), with focus on how social, economic and political conditions change during such periods. In addition to long-run and foundational questions, the course covers recent topics such as the 2008 financial crisis and the recent turmoil in the BRIC economies and other emerging markets, as well as recent intellectual developments on the role of institutions and the importance of state formation and cultural dimensions of development.
