Description This particular course on Contemporary Asia focuses on the integration and synthesis of culture, economics and politics in the Asian societies to increase an understanding of the region, in its contemporary social-political and cultural setting.  - Politico-cultural obstacles for intra-regional cooperation

 - Intercultural interaction
 - Cultural forces in society.
