It covers topics such as international trade and the role of the World Trade Organisation, foreign direct investments, financial globalisation, global environmental regulations, and migration. What will you learn in this course? Having completed the course, you will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•understand the economic impact of important global issues;</li> <li>•understand how globalisation matters for firms' strategies and policy;</li> <li>•evaluate global economic governance and policies.</li> <li>•discuss, argue and debate the pros and cons concerning current global issues from different perspectives (advanced economies vs. emerging markets)</li> <li>•run a simple empirical analysis and write an empirical paper, which will prepare you for the thesis</li> </ul>
