Description	This module provides students the opportunity to develop and apply entrepreneurial skills to address complex social and environmental problems. Students will explore the role of entrepreneurial action from new organisations (entrepreneurship) and existing organisations (intrapreneurship) in contributing to sustainability transitions. This course is structured around experiential problem-based learning, providing students the opportunity to synthesise theory and practice as they develop an idea for their own sustainable enterprises. Topics will include: critically reviewing concepts of sustainable entrepreneurship/intrapreneurship; user centred-design of social and sustainable enterprises; frameworks for understanding and strategizing; understanding and reporting social and environmental impact; sustainable investment.
