Analyse the reasons why such inequalities arise, and the connection between them 3. Being able to develop and evaluate policy tools that can be used to mitigate the causes and/or consequences of inequality 4. Being able to read and evaluate empirical research analysing these issues 																
Description	This course studies examples of how inequality must be understood in terms of its causes and consequences and how it can be managed by policy (if necessary). Therefore, the course consists of case studies analysing different inequalities with respect to their causes, consequences, and policy tools. Examples of case studies are inequalities in the labour market (e.g. gender, discrimination), education, or health, as well as income inequality between countries or regions and over time, and climate change resulting in intergenerational and interregional inequality.
